Re: Death of Baby Elephant at Phuket Zoo

Dear Mr Thepparuk,

We are writing on behalf of the **Asia for Animals Coalition**, representing international animal welfare and conservation organizations.

We express our gratitude to you and your department for attempting to intervene in the case of the emaciated baby elephant, known as "Dumbo", who recently died at the Phuket Zoo.

However, we write to you with great concern regarding the purchase and placement of any additional elephants at the zoo. The zoo has failed to meet the most basic physical and behavioural needs that are fundamental to keeping elephants in captivity. 1

Several visits to the Phuket Zoo have shown that the elephants are chained for long periods of time and forced to stand on an unsuitable surface, when not being forced to perform tricks for tourists.

Standards for animal care set out by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums require that elephants receive appropriate veterinary care and that their nutritional, social, behavioral, and psychological needs should all be met.² The Phuket Zoo has failed in its provision of these basic needs and has chosen to exploit the elephants as photo props and performers for the entertainment of tourists.

Baby "Dumbo" was severely neglected by the Phuket Zoo. He was placed in the zoo when he was too young and forced to perform tricks against his natural behaviours and instincts. The zoo then failed to seek treatment for him when he became ill, leading to his severe malnourishment and resulting in both his back legs being broken due to such neglect. We have received reports from a reputable source that these excruciating injuries went unnoticed by the zoo for three days prior to his death.

Animals confined to zoos must be treated appropriately and provided veterinary care such that they are maintained to the highest possible standard.

We respectfully request that your office:

- 1. does not allow the Phuket Zoo to acquire any additional elephants;
- 2. requires the zoo to seek expert advice and support from the Krabi Elephant Hospital by way of a veterinary assessment of the two remaining elephants at the zoo;
- 3. seeks independent expert welfare advice on the zoo's suitability to meet the physical and behavioural needs of these elephants; and
- 4. takes appropriate action if such advice deems the zoo unable to provide the elephants with the care and management they require.

On behalf of our members around the globe, we thank you for your attention to this letter and once again implore you to take immediate action to ensure that no other elephant suffers as Dumbo did at Phuket Zoo.
